10. <u>that you may approve</u> the things that are **excellent**, that you may be **sincere** and without **offense** till the day of Christ,

11. *being filled* with the **fruits** of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, to the glory and **praise** of God.

10. <u>*They*</u> desired only that we should remember the poor, the very thing which I also was eager to do.

11. <u>Now when Peter had come to Antioch</u>, I withstood him to his face, because he was to be **blamed**;
